Job Description

Purpose

The youth leader will be responsible for coordinating and developing work in the church with young people attending school at S1 – S6 and young adults.

This work is aimed at:

- Helping young people who are associated with the church to come to a personal faith in Jesus Christ and set out on life as Christians, equipped to cope with life's issues and serve God in our church, community and world.
- Drawing other young people from the community into a living personal faith in Jesus Christ, particularly through the witness of those already within the youth programme.
- Being accountable by taking responsibility for leading a team of church volunteers.

Major Tasks

Young People:

- Building relationships, teaching, and discipling young people. Leadership and management of the Youth ministry, ensuring ongoing programme development, implementation and evaluation.
- Enthuse, empower, and enable volunteers to help serve in youth ministry, ensuring they are supported and empowered by fostering a strong, supportive team environment among volunteers and other ministry leaders. Work alongside other church teams, leaders, and ministries to foster a unified, interdenominational and holistic approach to ministry.
- Develop pastoral care for young people with intentional thought, preparation, and support at key stages/transition points. Be familiar with and implement safeguarding practices and principles.
- Co-ordinate the integration of youth into worship services.

Outreach:

- To design and create outreach programmes which align with the church's mission and values which inspire and invite young people to encounter faith and grow in their understanding of Christ.
- To implement imaginative, fun, and engaging programmes, activities & events that resonate with unchurched young people, and encourage and inspire them in life and faith i.e. Sunday evening programme, youth camps and social outings.

- Build strong connections with local schools and community groups to extend the church's partnerships and influence.
- Organise and support appropriate shared initiatives with young people within the community.

Essential Requirements

Faith and Commitment:

- A personal commitment to the Christian faith and be willing to become an active member of our church community.
- Understanding of the mission and values of the church, with a passion for supporting young people in their spiritual, emotional, and social growth.
- To build relationships with young people's families.

Essential Experience:

- Working with young people (either in a volunteer or paid capacity).
- Leading or facilitating group activities, especially with young people.
- Serving within a church team environment.

Skills and Knowledge:

- Strong communication and interpersonal skills, with the ability to engage and build relationships with young people.
- Ability to plan, lead, and deliver engaging youth activities, programs, and events.
- Understanding of safeguarding and child protection policies and procedures.
- Ability to work with young people with diverse needs, including those from different cultural, social, and economic backgrounds.
- A passion for mentoring and supporting young people in their spiritual journeys and personal development.

Desirable Qualifications and Experience:

- A relevant qualification in youth work, theology, or ministry (e.g. youth ministry training or youth work qualification).

Personal Attributes

Faith-Based Commitment:

- A genuine, personal commitment to developing and sharing faith with young people.
- A deep understanding of the Bible and an ability to teach and share biblical principles with young people in an engaging and accessible way.

Relational and Approachable:

- A warm, approachable, and empathetic personality, able to connect with young people and earn their trust.
- Able to engage and form positive relationships with parents, church leaders, and volunteers.

Flexibility and Initiative:

- Able to adapt to the changing needs of young people and the church community.
- Able to take initiative and work independently but also collaborate within a team.

Confidentiality and Integrity:

- High level of personal integrity and respect for confidentiality.
- A role model for young people in terms of behaviour, attitudes, and faith.

Working Conditions:

- The role will involve evening and weekend work to lead youth programs, events or trips.
- Regular attendance at church services and youth activities is expected.
- Reporting regularly to line management to discuss work streams, submit expenses and weekly time sheets.
- Accept and seek support and prayer.
- Submit and present short reports for monthly Deacons' and quarterly Church meetings detailing current and planned work.
- This role is subject to an enhanced PVG check and safeguarding training.
